- A RESPONSIBLE ADULT MUST CHECK IN EACH SCOUT IN PERSON AT THE REGISTRATION TABLE

THE PURPOSE OF THE WORKSHOP IS TO INTRODUCE BADGES TO THE SCOUTS AND TO HELP THEM UNDERSTAND THE MERIT BADGE PROCESS. FOR MOST OF THE MERIT BADGES SCOUTS WILL BE ABLE TO OBTAIN A "PARTIAL" BUT WILL NOT BE ABLE TO COMPLETE THE MERIT BADGE AT THIS EVENT.

Each session will include an explanation of how to earn the merit badge; how to approach merit badge counselors in general; and what steps are necessary at both the troop and personal level before contacting a counselor.

Where listed, prerequisites must be done prior to the class.

Scouts will receive "partials" for the work they complete in class and they will then contact either the instructor or a Scoutmaster-assigned MB counselor in their area to finish the badge.
